
## NBPD Monthly Update – August 2025

**NEW BERLIN POLICE CRIME STATISTICS:** In July of 2025, the New Berlin Police Department initiated or responded to **2674 calls for service**. The graphs below represent primary categories during this reporting period in which our patrol division allocated resources. The graphs (3-year comparisons) are categorized into four types of Calls for Service (CFS): Crimes Against Person, Property Crime, Alcohol & Drug Activity and Citizen Welfare Assessments.







**WELL-BEING CHECKS:** The graph below captures the number of calls for service involving well-being assessments and two of the potential dispositions related to this type of call for service, a referral to the Aging & Disability Resource Center (ADRC) of Waukesha County and Protective Custody under WI Statute chapter 51. ADRC referrals are resources allocated for adults aged 60 and above, caregivers, adults with physical or developmental disabilities (to include dementia) and adults with mental health or substance use concerns. Chapter 51 protective placement is an “emergency detention” of patients in need of immediate care primarily due to self-harm or other destructive behavior.



**REFERRALS FOR CRIMINAL PROSECUTION:** In July of 2025, the New Berlin PD referred 80 charges involving adult & Juvenile offenders to the Waukesha County District Attorney's Office for case review, reference misdemeanor or felony prosecution. Additionally, 15 criminal traffic citations were issued.



**REFERRALS FOR MUNICIPAL PROSECUTION:** In July of 2025, the New Berlin PD issued a total of 470 municipal citations for non-criminal prosecution in New Berlin Municipal Court. 416 citations were traffic related, 45 citations were non-traffic related & 9 citations were for impaired driving (Operating While Intoxicated, Operating w/ a Prohibited Alcohol Content or Operating w/ a Restricted Controlled Substance.)





## **WAUKESHA COUNTY PERSON SPECIFIC INFORMATION FOR FIRST RESPONDERS:**

**RESPONDERS:** In an effort to facilitate a positive & productive interaction and a more accurate situational assessment involving residents with special needs, the New Berlin Police Department, in collaboration with Waukesha County, utilizes a "Person Specific Information For First Responders (PSIFFR) tool" to obtain person-specific information of both children and adults with special needs. The information requested on this electronically fillable tool is for the sole purpose of enhancing the preparedness and effectiveness of first responders and emergency dispatchers with calls for service involving children/adults in the community with special needs or who are otherwise at-risk due to a diminished mental/physical capacity and

other health challenges. The information captured on the PSIFFR tool is entered into a secure Waukesha County database so if the person you care for ever needs to be assisted by an agency within Waukesha County, that agency will have access to crucial information to do so more effectively. If you would like to participate in this program, complete the PSIFFR tool accessed via this link: [CLICK HERE](#) Upon completion, you will be able to submit it directly to Waukesha County for review and subsequent input into their database. The information provided on this form will assist police, fire or emergency response personnel ONLY when they are responding to an emergency or other call to your residence, or the purposes of identifying and/or assisting you or another individual in your household who is living with a disability or health challenge. All submissions are purged from the database every two years; therefore, please resubmit a new form at two-year intervals, or sooner, if the content of the form needs to be revised.


**BREWER TRADING CARDS:** Hot of the press, our officers will be distributing Brewer Trading Cards while supplies last!





**SCHOOL BUS SAFETY:** With most area schools beginning their 2025 – 2026 school year within the next month, our Department will be focusing on motorists violating traffic laws pertaining to school buses dropping off and picking up children. Wisconsin statutes mandate that motorists must stop at least 20 feet from any school bus that has stopped and is flashing red warning lights. This applies to both vehicles approaching the school bus from the rear and opposing lanes. All lanes of traffic must stop for the school bus, except in opposing lanes if the highway is divided with a center median. No vehicle may proceed until the school bus resumes motion and has turned off the red warning lights. The stop arm on the bus is added communication to motorists, but the lack of an extended stop arm is not reason to pass a bus with flashing red lights. The below graphic is a snapshot of motorist responsibility when a school bus is stopped with its red warning lights flashing:


