





NBPD Monthly Update – September 2025

NEW BERLIN POLICE CRIME STATISTICS: In August of 2025, the New Berlin Police Department initiated or responded to **2859 calls for service**. The graphs below represent primary categories during this reporting period in which our patrol division allocated resources. The graphs (3-year comparisons) are categorized into four types of Calls for Service (CFS): Crimes Against Person, Property Crime, Alcohol & Drug Activity and Citizen Welfare Assessments.



Alchol & Drug Activity




WELL-BEING CHECKS: The graph below captures the number of calls for service involving well-being assessments and two of the potential dispositions related to this type of call for service, a referral to the Aging & Disability Resource Center (ADRC) of Waukesha County and Protective Custody under WI Statute chapter 51. ADRC referrals are resources allocated for adults aged 60 and above, caregivers, adults with physical or developmental disabilities (to include dementia) and adults with mental health or substance use concerns. Chapter 51 protective placement is an “emergency detention” of patients in need of immediate care primarily due to self-harm or other destructive behavior.



REFERRALS FOR CRIMINAL PROSECUTION: In August of 2025, the New Berlin PD referred 58 charges involving adult & Juvenile offenders to the Waukesha County District Attorney's Office for case review, reference misdemeanor or felony prosecution. Additionally, 25 criminal traffic citations were issued.



REFERRALS FOR MUNICIPAL PROSECUTION: In August of 2025, the New Berlin PD issued a total of 441 municipal citations for non-criminal prosecution in New Berlin Municipal Court. 407 citations were traffic related, 26 citations were non-traffic related & 8 citations were for impaired driving (Operating While Intoxicated, Operating w/ a Prohibited Alcohol Content or Operating w/ a Restricted Controlled Substance.)



CRIME ALERT – THEFT FROM UNLOCKED VEHICLES: In August of 2025, 25 residents reported their UNLOCKED vehicles were entered and, in about half of the incidents, property was stolen. Several other residents also reported their external surveillance cameras captured offender(s), checking to see if vehicles parked in their driveways were locked and moving on once they were unable to gain easy access. Please, please, please LOCK your vehicles and remove valuable items from plain sight! Yes, it's that easy to reduce the offender's opportunity to victimize you! SAFETY TIPS FOR DRIVERS

BACK TO SCHOOL



PLEASE SLOW DOWN

School days bring congestion: kids are on bikes hurrying to get to school, parents are trying to drop their kids off before work. It is very important for drivers to slow down and pay attention than when kids are present - especially before and after school.



IF YOU ARE DROPPING OFF

More children are hit by cars near schools than at any other location. The following apply to all school zones: don't double park, don't load or unload children across the street from the school, carpool to reduce the number of vehicles at the school.



SHARE THE ROAD WITH YOUNG CHILDREN

According to the NSC, most of the children who lose their lives in bus-related incidents are 4-7 years old, and they are walking. They are hit by the bus, or by a motorist illegally passing a stopped bus.



SHARE THE ROAD WITH BUSES

If you are driving behind a bus, allow a greater following distance than if you were driving behind a car. It will give you more time to stop once the yellow lights start flashing. It is illegal in all 50 states to pass a school bus that is stopped to load or unload children.



SHARE THE ROAD WITH BICYCLISTS

On most roads, bicyclists have the same rights as vehicles. Children riding bikes create problems for drivers because usually they are not able to properly determine traffic conditions. The most common cause of collision is a driver turning left in front of a bicyclist


