
NBPD Monthly Update – October 2025

NEW BERLIN POLICE CRIME STATISTICS: In September of 2025, the New Berlin Police Department initiated or responded to **2628 calls for service**. The graphs below represent primary categories during this reporting period in which our patrol division allocated resources. The graphs (3-year comparisons) are categorized into four types of Calls for Service (CFS): Crimes Against Person, Property Crime, Alcohol & Drug Activity and Citizen Welfare Assessments.







WELL-BEING CHECKS: The graph below captures the number of calls for service involving well-being assessments and two of the potential dispositions related to this type of call for service, a referral to the Aging & Disability Resource Center (ADRC) of Waukesha County and Protective Custody under WI Statute chapter 51. ADRC referrals are resources allocated for adults aged 60 and above, caregivers, adults with physical or developmental disabilities (to include dementia) and adults with mental health or substance use concerns. Chapter 51 protective placement is an “emergency detention” of patients in need of immediate care primarily due to self-harm or other destructive behavior.



REFERRALS FOR CRIMINAL PROSECUTION: In September of 2025, the New Berlin PD referred 585 charges involving adult & Juvenile offenders to the Waukesha County District Attorney's Office for case review, reference misdemeanor or felony prosecution. Additionally, 44 criminal traffic citations were issued.



REFERRALS FOR MUNICIPAL PROSECUTION: In September of 2025, the New Berlin PD issued a total of 506 municipal citations for non-criminal prosecution in New Berlin Municipal Court. 451 citations were traffic related, 39 citations were non-traffic related & 14 citations were for impaired driving (Operating While Intoxicated, Operating w/ a Prohibited Alcohol Content or Operating w/ a Restricted Controlled Substance.)



OPEN BURNING: October 1st – November 15th, New Berlin Municipal Code allows for open burning, with a **PERMIT**, Wednesday – Saturday. [CLICK HERE](#) for a direct link to review the municipal code.

City Code – Chapter 124-12L(1-5) Open Burning

Except as hereinafter provided, no person shall burn, cause to be burned or permit to burn any fire outside of a building. Burning permits are required and must be displayed prominently during burning. Both the person igniting such fire and the owner of lands upon which such fire may occur shall be equally responsible for compliance with the requirements of this subsection. Violations of any of the stipulations in the Ordinance may cause a citation to be issued. First violation forfeiture is \$214.80 plus costs & surcharges. Second and any additional violations are \$328.20 plus costs and surcharges.

1. Burning is allowed only with a permit during the following:
 - ✓April 1 to May 15: Wednesdays through Saturdays
 - ✓October 1 to November 15: Wednesdays through Saturdays
 - ✓Remainder of year: Wednesdays AND Saturdays only
 - ✓*Burning is never allowed on Sundays, Mondays, and Tuesdays.*
2. Burning is limited to grass, fallen leaves, brush or similar vegetation materials.
3. Burning of rubbish, garbage, trash, plastic, leather or petroleum based materials as prohibited.
4. Burning is not allowed in barrels or containers.
5. The size of the pile of material burned shall not exceed 4 ft. x 4 ft. x 3 ft. high.
6. Any open pile of burning material shall be at least 50 feet from any structure, wood or lumber pile or wooden fence.
7. Burning and the disposal of ash residue are not permitted on or within any improved street, drainage ditch, alley, parkway, public place or public right-of-way.
8. Burning is allowed between 7AM to ½ hour after sunset.
9. Burning is prohibited when wind velocity exceeds nine (9) mph.
10. Burning is not allowed in any industrial park or when indicated by deed restriction.
11. Material to be burned shall not be ignited with flammable or combustible liquids.
12. Burning shall be supervised by a person at least 16 years of age and personally attended by a person who must remain within 20 feet of such fire until fire is completely extinguished. This person must have fire-extinguishing equipment available within 20 feet of fire available for immediate use.
13. No fire shall be conducted or permitted which results in the production of smoke that interferes substantially with the comfortable enjoyment of life, health or safety of another person when such interference results in significant harm. For purposes of this subsection, "significant harm" shall mean harm which causes more than slight inconvenience or annoyance. If the harm is substantially offensive, seriously annoying or intolerable, as measured by ordinary persons living in the City, then harm shall be deemed to be significant.
14. Bonfires or campfires for aesthetic and social enjoyment are exempt from purchasing a permit but must comply with rules 3, 4, 5, 6, 9, 10, 11 and 13.

NEW BERLIN TRICK OR TREAT – SATURDAY OCTOBER 25th – 4-7 PM: City ordinance 188-17 prohibits a “designated” sex offender to actively take part in any public holiday event involving children where the distributing of candy or other items to children takes place, including but not limited to holiday parades or similar gatherings, Halloween trick-or-treating, wearing a seasonable costume in a public place, or wearing any other costume reasonably expected to attract children in a public place, or other similar activities that may, under the circumstances then present, tend to entice a child to have contact with a designated offender. HALLOWEEN SAFETY

Halloween is one of the most anticipated nights of the year for kids, but Safe Kids’ research* shows some scary statistics on Halloween safety.



Only **1/3** OF PARENTS talk to their kids annually about Halloween, although 3/4 report having Halloween safety fears.

On average, **TWICE AS MANY CHILD PEDESTRIANS** are killed while walking on Halloween compared to other days of the year.

Only **18%** of parents use reflective tape on their children’s Halloween costumes.

12% of children five years of age or younger are permitted to trick-or-treat alone.


Children under 12 should trick-or-treat and **CROSS STREETS WITH AN ADULT**

ALWAYS WALK ON SIDEWALKS OR PATHS if there are no sidewalks, walk facing traffic as far to the side as possible.

Cross the street at corners, **USING TRAFFIC SIGNALS** and crosswalks. Parents should remind children to watch for cars that are turning or backing up.

DRIVERS SHOULD SLOW DOWN and be especially alert in residential neighborhoods. Children are excited on Halloween and may move in unpredictable ways.
