







NBPD Monthly Update – November 2025

NEW BERLIN POLICE CRIME STATISTICS: In October of 2025, the New Berlin Police Department initiated or responded to **2481 calls for service**. The graphs below represent primary categories during this reporting period in which our patrol division allocated resources. The graphs (3-year comparisons) are categorized into four types of Calls for Service (CFS): Crimes Against Person, Property Crime, Alcohol & Drug Activity and Citizen Welfare Assessments.







WELL-BEING CHECKS: The graph below captures the number of calls for service involving well-being assessments and two of the potential dispositions related to this type of call for service, a referral to the Aging & Disability Resource Center (ADRC) of Waukesha County and Protective Custody under WI Statute chapter 51. ADRC referrals are resources allocated for adults aged 60 and above, caregivers, adults with physical or developmental disabilities (to include dementia) and adults with mental health or substance use concerns. Chapter 51 protective placement is an “emergency detention” of patients in need of immediate care primarily due to self-harm or other destructive behavior.




REFERRALS FOR CRIMINAL PROSECUTION: In October of 2025, the New Berlin PD referred 32 charges involving adult & Juvenile offenders to the Waukesha County District Attorney's Office for case review, reference misdemeanor or felony prosecution. Additionally, 26 criminal traffic citations were issued.



REFERRALS FOR MUNICIPAL PROSECUTION: In October of 2025, the New Berlin PD issued a total of 463 municipal citations for non-criminal prosecution in New Berlin Municipal Court. 413 citations were traffic related, 40 citations were non-traffic related & 9 citations were for impaired driving (Operating While Intoxicated, Operating w/ a Prohibited Alcohol Content or Operating w/ a Restricted Controlled Substance.)



NATIONAL DRUG TAKE BACK DAY COLLECTION RESULTS (10/25/2025): Since 2014, the NBPD and Froedtert & the Medical College of WI have partnered to host a biannual Drug Take Back event. The objective of a drug take back event is to provide the community with a safe manner in which to dispose of unused and expired medications, prior to them finding their way into the wrong hands. Saturday's drive-thru event brought out **217 vehicles** and yielded approximately **538 pounds** of unused and expired medications. Since partnering with Froedtert, we have hosted 22 events in which we have collected **13,831 pounds** of medication. The medications are boxed and ultimately incinerated while the containers are sanitized of personal identifying information and recycled. Thank you to all the volunteers that made this event possible and the community that took advantage of the opportunity to safely dispose of their unwanted medications. Our next drug take back event is tentatively scheduled for October 25th, 2025, at the Froedtert-New Berlin Campus. 


TIPS TO AVOID PACKAGE THEFT: With global ecommerce projected to exceed \$6.4 trillion this holiday season, there is greater opportunity for offenders to intercept your delivery prior to you removing it from your front porch. Please follow these tips to avoid package theft:



- Network with Neighbors
- Have Packages Delivered to Work
- Leave Specific Drop-off Instructions
- Use a Smart Lock
- Install Security Cameras
- Get a P.O. Box at Your Local Post Office
- Use Lockers
- Set Up Notifications to Track Your Packages
- Require a Signature on Delivery
- Insure Your Packages
- Opt for In-Store Pickup
- Keep your Porch Well-Lit
- IMMEDIATELY REPORT SUSPICIOUS BEHAVIOR!!!
